prayers. To live happily every day sometimes we play children's games and that's what we do with my family together with other young people in the church? What? In the church! Am I joking NO! we did play conjuring game in the church. Ha..ha..

Brethren, thank you so much for always praying for my family and for helping me meet their needs.

Six months from now my wife will be graduating from college, in spite of the many times we are discouraged on how she could continue going to school God made the way through you. By the grace of God , my wife was able to maintain

her grades for her academic scholarship that even in her school only two students is able to sustain the 75% academic scholarship that requires student to maintain a 1.3 grades or 97 %.

Next month she will be tested how good she is in teaching in the actual school with real students. Right now we would like to ask your prayers for her uniform needs for her practicum (practice teaching) any amount of kindness for my wife need is very much welcome.

tized 4 months ago has transferred a new place in General Santos city. 4 members of the church has gone. So we have to start again. Even in the many shorthanded and bad circumstances that we continuously encounter still our desire to serve the Lord never been set aside. We'll work until Jesus comes because we believe that in serving the Lord there is not room for excuses. Right now we only have 12 active members remained in our church and

the rest are visitors. Most of the time our attendance reaches to 20 not included the children. For me theres only two options the church grow accordingly; first the option of renting a new place in the center of Babak where people can easily find our church.

Then the option of purchasing a new permanent place for church in Babak. In these option we have to sale first our present church property and building. Then after we secure a new Lot, then we can apply to PMD (Philippine Mission Development) to Ptr. Wayne Stringer for our church building.

Right now my wife and I were the once who are working for a while as we arrange and ask the approval of the Seminary to request our student workers only for Monday mornings then they can go back to the Seminary after Lunch. Our elementary ministry has started last Monday with over 219 grade six pupils and 2 accepted Jesus seriously.

The task given to me as chaplain by the government creates so much opportunity for me to preach the word of God to the places where there is no Bible believing church. In my first

lecture experience in Toril Village 81 adults gathered together in the morning to listen the word of God. 46 adults bow down in tears accepting Jesus as their savior including a Village chieftain.

September 10, in Tagbitan-ag village, there were 114 adults gathered together for one purpose to listen the word of God. By the power of God together

with the working power of the Holy Spirit the 114 souls received the Lord as their savior very dramatically with tears of confession and profession of faith. And they requested me to come back for a visit because they want to know more of the Bible. In all these great, great victory in the word of God, what would you think Satan do to stop me from doing?

Tuesday evening my body suffers a fever flu at the same time my Daughter Blessie got sick too. But in spite of the circumstances still I decided to preach to my next schedule place the Libuak Village using my vehicle.

In this village, 91 came and 46 of those were Muslims. Honestly I was intimidated by the Muslim attendees thinking of not to use any verse from the Bible. But

words can't be controlled when the Spirit speaks. During my lecture about family verses from the word of God continuously comes out from my mouth and during our reflection 13 male and 9 female Muslim cried out to the Lord for salvation. And 7 non Muslim accepted the Lord. And all of them the 91 adults requested to me for a copy of the BIBLE. These people that I

am preaching were the beneficiaries of Pantawid Pamilyang Pilipino Program of the government. They were the Poorest among the Poor. Every time I have preaching and Lecture schedule the Local government will pay for my transportation but my preaching and lecture efforts is free. I did not ask any payment because preaching the word of God is free.
